

The following article (in both languages) is written by the current president of the L.A. Okinawan-kais in California. This is from last year's newsletter of the Okinawan Cultural Association called OAA (Okinawa American Association), the first Okinawa Kenjinkai in America, established 107 years ago in 1909!

OAA newsletter Dec. 2015

The 6th Worldwide Uchinanchu Festival is set for Oct 26-30, 2016, in Okinawa. Thousands of Okinawans are expected to come from overseas to celebrate home coming and reunion. The Okinawa Prefectural Gov't (OPG) started the festival or Taikai in 1990 and has held every 5 years. Attendance has increased each time. The last Taikai was in 2011 and attended by 5,300 overseas participants from 18 countries.

If you have not been to the Taikai, I urge you to go there this time. You will feel Okinawa's power and hospitality; you feel immediately that you are accepted as one of them. The best way to know the country and people is to live there and mingle with local people. You may encounter life-changing

experiences and people. The Okinawa Association of America is a diverse group of people. Many are American-born and never been to Okinawa, though they may have ancestral connection to Okinawa. The Uchinanchu Taikai is a good opportunity to reconnect with our Okinawan roots. Many municipalities have welcome parties for those whose ancestors may have left their villages or towns generations ago.

It is estimated that 390,000 Okinawans and Okinawa-related people live in overseas. This number is 28 percent of the current Okinawan population (1,400, 000). Most Okinawans have family, relatives, or friends outside of Japan, and Okinawans are outward-looking. Globalization is a current trend and the world is economically and culturally becoming interdependent. Overseas Okinawans are considered resources for Okinawa, and the OPG offers scholarships to the children of Okinawan immigrants, and invite us to the Taikai every 5 years. When we return to Okinawa, we receive new inspiration and strength. We like to maintain mutually beneficial relationship with Okinawa.

5年に一度の「世界のウチナーンチュ大会」は 2016年10月26日から30日まで沖縄で開催される。長く故郷を離れているウチナーンチュをシマに帰ってもらい、歓迎するという趣意で1990年から始まった。その後、5年ごとに大会を開いている。会を重ねるごとに海外からの参加者は増えている。前回、2011年の大会には5,300名の人たちが海外18諸国から参加した。これまでは宜野湾市のコンベンションセンターで行っていたが、2011年から3万人入るという那覇市のセルラー野球場をメイン会場としている。特に開会式と閉会式は音楽、太鼓、旗頭などで熱気が上がった。前夜祭は海外参加者が各國のプラカードを先頭に国際通りを行列して、沿道の群衆から歓迎され、お祭り気分が盛り上がった。ウチナーンチュ大会に行ったことがない人は来年10月の大会にぜひ行くように薦めます。

海外に沖縄系の人が39万人いるという。この数は沖縄県の人口(140万人)の28パーセントにあたる。沖縄では海外に住んだとか、海外に家族や親しい友人がいるというケースが多い。それだけ、海外を身近に感じている。沖縄県は移住者やその子弟を大切にしている。優秀な子弟には奨学金を与えて、沖縄の大学で勉強させる制度もある。また、市町村単位で若者の海外との交流事業も行っている。また、5年に一度、海外のウチナーンチュを招待して、大交流会をする。私たちも時々沖縄に行って、沖縄の暖かさを感じて、勇気をもらう。終戦直後、海外のウチナーンチュが団結して、戦争で破壊された故郷を援助したことがある。それを覚えている人が海外にも沖縄にもまだいる。県人会は会員の相互扶助を大切にしてきたが、私たちを思って、頼りにしている人たちが沖縄にいることも忘れないようにしたい。沖縄との交流を深めて、互いに助け合うようにしたい。
